Inside this issue:

This past year saw the completion of the south Fryburg Service Area which meant an additional 83 customers for SWPP, south of Belfield. SWPP also installed generators at the raw water pump stations at Richardton and Dodge. This will help provide water service, even in a power outage. The generators will be able to run a 700-horsepower pump at the Dodge Pump Station with 1,000 kilowatt (kW) capacity, running a 1,482-horsepower engine and a 900horsepower pump at the Richardton Pump Station with a 1,500 kW capacity, running a 2,205-horsepower engine. SWPP will be able to continue to serve our customers should an outage occur. Under normal circumstances, the SWPP

can flow 1,600 - 2,200 gallons per minute (gpm) by gravity through the raw water system. With the generators at these locations, running one pump will pump 7,450 gpm at Dodge and 7,050 gpm at Richardton.

The SWA Board of Directors held their monthly board meeting in November in Mandan. Representatives from Mandan, Morton County, Missouri West Water System, Missouri River Joint Board and the Morton County Water Resource District attended the board meeting. It is greatly appreciated that all these individuals took time out of their busy schedules to show their support of SWPP. What a great opportunity this was for SWA to connect with these local partners.

With the retirement of Jim Dworshak, Roger Dick has been promoted to Water Treatment Plant (WTP) Manager. This was effective January 1. 2008. I would like to wish Jim well and thank him for his service to SWA and to all the citizens of southwest North Dakota. I would also like to congratulate Roger on his promotion. Roger has always been an asset to SWA & SWPP. He will do well in his new management position. I am very pleased that Roger is heading up the WTP.

Rural water canvass overwhelmingly successful


The need for a reliable source of quality water continues to be evident in southwest North Dakota. Over 600 additional rural water signups were received as a result of a final canvassing conducted by the Southwest Water Authority (SWA) in the counties of Oliver, Mercer and north Dunn. The campaign encompassed rural areas near the cities of Killdeer, Dunn Center, Halliday, Dodge, Pick City, Hazen, Golden Valley, Zap, Center, Stanton and Beulah.

The number of signups illustrates the need, as well as support for rural water in the Oliver, Mercer, North Dunn Service Area. Before final design of the Southwest Pipeline Project (SWPP) can begin, the total number of signups must be gathered in this service area. This enables us to determine if we meet the construction cost per user and the 50 percent sign up among rural customers, criteria established by the ND State Water Commission and the SWA Board of Directors.

The public information meetings were well attended. Hosting these meetings continues to be key in updating the public on construction progress. Roger and Carmen Reed of Hazen, North Dakota were winners in a drawing for dinner for two at a location of their choice in Oliver, Mercer or Dunn County.

Until the project is bid, the rate for new signups is \$750.00. Cindy's Water Notes

Reading your water meter monthly is important for you, as well as for Southwest Water Authority (SWA). Here's why. Meter readings assist in the detection of leaks or other potential meter problems. Be aware that remote meters have been known to stick or register incorrectly at times. Problems such as these are discovered by reading the meter monthly.

When reporting your meter reading, please ensure all seven numbers are recorded, even if the numbers are zero or stationary. To receive credit for the 2,000 gallons of water billed each month, a seven digit meter reading is necessary. To ensure even billing or avoid drastic fluctuations from month to month, it is also important to read your meter consistently. Try to read your meter each month on the same date, if possible.
