If you have yet to do so, we strongly encourage you to do it at your earliest convenience. The information gathered in this survey plays a critical role in ensuring that our customers' drinking water remains safe, as it helps us to identify potential issues related to privately owned pipes that may contain lead. Furthermore, it presents an excellent opportunity for you to receive a credit on your water bill. Since the ND Department of Environmental

Quality mandates this information for every water connection, we kindly request your cooperation. In the event that surveys are not returned, our operators will have to follow up with each customer account to collect the necessary information. In support of SWA's expansion efforts, a signup campaign is underway for the Hebron and Burt Service Area, spanning Grant County, including Lake Tschida, and extending into portions of Hettinger, Adams, Stark and Morton Counties. Interest and commitment continue to grow as we work through preliminary design and determine feasibility. We urge everyone in these areas to sign up to help ensure no one is left behind as we move into the final design phase. If you have already signed up to connect, we assure you that we remain steadfast in the design, development and advocacy of funding for construction. Watch for notifications for public meetings in near future when we hold a public meeting in Grant County. If you are a property owner in this area and have not signed up - contact us today.

Construction work continues on the strategic hydraulic improvements in the vicinity of Amidon, New Hradec, Fairfield and Killdeer Mountains. The pipeline installation for these contracts is expected to be completed this fall, while the boosters will be installed in the spring. Additional Strategic Hydraulic Improvements across the service area are being prioritized and those on waiting lists will be contacted if their location could be served. Other ongoing construction design includes the expansion of the Southwest Water Treatment Plant and the design of upgrades to the West Zone Transmission Facilities.

As management for the Southwest Pipeline Project (Project), a crossing of a water lines easement requires prior approval by **Southwest Water Authority** (SWA). Approval for any easement crossing of the Project can only be granted by SWA based upon signed acknowledgement of and intent to comply with a list of conditions required. The applications and conditions for such crossing can be found on SWA's website under crossing permits.

Winterizing Water Pipes

When the weather turns cold – it's time to winterize. Be sure to turn off irrigation systems and blow out irrigation lines with air. Disconnect hoses and store them. Taking these steps will ensure a safe transition into the colder temperatures. Below are some tips on how to manage water lines during the winter months.

- Insulate pipes exposed to cold air
- Seal openings allowing cold air inside
- Properly shutdown the irrigation system
- ♠ Remove, drain, and store all water hoses
- Keep the home's temperature above 55 degrees




Changing Ownership?

If you are buying or selling a property with an existing Southwest Water Authority (SWA) water connection, please contact our office at least seven days prior to the property closing. To transfer a property's SWA water connection, you will need to provide the past and future owners' signatures. If you are using a real estate agent, they can help facilitate this process by bringing the paperwork to closing. Be sure to provide the previous owner's name, account number, or legal description for easier identification. It is important to let our customers know that if parcels are split, the water needs to be allocated to one user, not multiple owners.

Grant County Signups Ongoing

The Signup and Easement Department of SWA is diligently gathering signups for properties located in Grant County and its adjacent regions. At present, almost 700 property owners have registered in the Burt, Hebron Service Area. Those who are interested in acquiring water services in this area are still able to sign up, and the feasibility and design of the project depend upon the number of individuals who enroll. Complete Survey to WIN up to \$500 of SWA's Quality Water!

In 2022, the U.S. Congress passed an amended Lead and Copper Rule that requires public water systems like SWA to create a Lead Service Line Inventory (LSLI) and submit it to the North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality. Thus, we are gathering this vital data from all accounts, including those not currently in use, such as pasture taps. Individuals with multiple accounts need to complete a separate survey for each tap to improve their chances of winning. Each month until December 31, 2023, a random drawing will reward a lucky participant with a \$100 prize. Entries will remain eligible throughout the entire duration of the contest. At the end of the year, there will be a drawing for a \$500 water credit. If you haven't done so already, please take a moment to scan the QR code or visit our website to access the survey.
